System Library Services 2018 Annual Report



2018 marked our first year of a unified PSJH System Library Services. When legacy Providence and legacy St. Joseph Health libraries came together, we became one of the first fully integrated departments in the enterprise. This created information equity, ensuring that ALL caregivers and providers now have access to the same evidence-based resources and professional library services no matter where they are located.

Resources & Services

Our integrated website, which launched in January, provides 24/7 access to our resources, both on site and off. The site was accessed more than 600,000 times in 2018, 500,000 articles were downloaded, and caregivers consulted our e-books more than 125,000 times. With the recent acquisition of more than 400 medical and nursing titles, our large collection of electronic journals continues to grow.

Our team of fifteen librarians and support staff served thousands of caregivers, providing rapid access to more than 40,000 full-text articles and helping providers stay up to date with more than 90,000 table of contents emails and current awareness searches. We filled more than 3,000 in-depth literature search requests. Through our expert instruction sessions, we helped more than 2,000 caregivers build confidence and self-efficacy in information access.

Innovation & Research

In July 2018, we launched Digital Commons, a System-wide institutional repository that collects and presents Providence St. Joseph Health research and other scholarly activity in one convenient, easily navigable location. 1470 articles, posters, presentations, and other documents were added to Digital Commons, with 3656 page hits and 779 downloads, an indicator that this initiative is helping to activate the voice of PSJH. Users interacted with items in Digital Commons 12,335 times through Facebook and Twitter. Articles from PSJH authors were cited 3636 times. Future directions we are exploring include: GME program profile pages, University of Providence capstone projects, and a platform for a peer-reviewed journal.

Special Projects and Ministry Engagement

Research & Quality Improvement

Our librarians throughout the System work closely with nurse researchers and have supported a number of published QI, EBP, and research projects. Librarians at St. Joseph of Orange were consulted throughout the process of developing a Code Compassion program, completing several searches of the published literature and conducting environmental scans of other institutions. Literature searches from the library were also used to develop a telesitter program to monitor patients at St. Joseph, St. Jude, Mission, and St. Mary. Both programs received newspaper and television coverage.

At St. Joseph Medical Center in Burbank, the librarian worked with nurse researchers to build a REDCap instrument for tracking ongoing projects in the ministry. Work on this instrument was later published in

Executive Summary

Providence St. Joseph Health System Library Services has modernized the delivery of evidence-based electronic resources and professional library services across a complex health system environment. Using an innovative integrative organizational model, System Library Services leverages the skills of a small group of professional library staff who deliver significant value broadly across the organization. Touching nearly every job role, in every ministry, library staff have an impact on nearly every aspect of Providence St. Joseph Health operations.



Strengthen the Core

System Library Services directly supports the work being done across the enterprise to improve health outcomes and the delivery of safe, high-value healthcare through our literature search, article delivery, topic alert, and table of contents services.

Library Staff provide resources, services, and, most importantly, training to support the development of PSJH caregivers in their current and future roles.

PSJH has made a huge monetary investment in evidence-based electronic resources. Library staff is essential to making sure those resources are selected and managed with stewardship in mind. In order for these resources to have value, library staff ensures that caregivers/providers are aware of and have ready access to these resources.



Be Our Communities' Health Partner

The work done to transform care and improve population health is directly supported by library staff who provide in-depth literature searching, update caregivers and providers on new research, and deliver evidence to support these programs.

System Library Services partners with caregivers and clinical institutes working to improve the patient experience and deliver whole patient care. Library staff provides the evidence to support physical, spiritual, and emotional well-being.



Transform Our Future

PSJH Researchers, healthcare innovators, and scholars make-up one of the most significant patron groups of System Library Services, who reach out to library staff for assistance with finding and accessing evidence to support their work, contribute to the development of study protocols, and provide publication assistance.

System Library Services tracks and promotes PSJH scholarly activity through the Digital Commons Institutional Repository and Expert Gallery, elevating the research presence of PJSH nationally.

partners and community health organizations within our market geographies. Library leadership is working closely with our 3 largest vendors to work through legal and licensing aspects and creating a business model. This is currently a service that does not exist in the market and requires new business models both for SLS and for publishers. This is another example of PSJH System Library Services innovating at the forefront.

The library is investigating setting up a Joanna Briggs Institute nursing research site at PSJH facilities which would be a potential for generating revenue.

Support of Strategic Pillars



Caregiver and Provider development

Library staff plays a key role in development of PSJH caregivers in their current roles and on their journey to grow beyond those roles.

- In 2017 alone library staff trained over 1000 caregivers on skills related to developing clinical questions, database searching, and assessing the quality of research.
- Library staff have created and continue to update educational modules, curricula and tutorials for the Clinical Academy (both at the system level and locally) and University of Providence.
- Library staff provide training medical and pharmacy residents and fellows. In some ministires librarians
 are part of the EMB faculty for the residency program, in others librarians present at noon conferences,
 or take part in problem-based learning sessions.
- Library staff provide EBP, nursing research, and publication training to nurses in boot camps and through
 individual and small group instruction. Librarians have participated in research protocol planning
 sessions.
- The library purchases resources that support continuing education needs of PSJH caregivers, including
 resources that provide free CME for physicians and CEU for nurses. The library created and maintains a
 page which highlights these CME/CEU opportunities.
