Background

- Hospitals in the United States report 700,000 to 1,000,000 falls in hospitalized patients (Preventing Falls in Hospital, 2021)
- Inconsistent nurse hourly rounding in Intermediate Stepdown Unit
- Consistent hourly rounding addressing the 4Ps (Pain, Position, Potty and Periphery) decreases falls and improves patient satisfaction

Purpose

- Improved nurse knowledge of hourly rounding using the 4P model
- Improved consistent hourly rounding, decreasing falls
- Improved HCAHPS vs Cipher rounding responsiveness scores

Nurse Education on 4Ps to Prevent Falls Merri Lynn M Anderson, BSN, RN, PCCN

Methods

- EBP with quality metrics
- Educate all staff on hourly rounding addressing the 4Ps
- Identify patient's fall risk at admit, during hospital stay, and those at risk of falling
- Inclusion criteria: All patients able to reposition and interact with the nurse

Results

Cipher rounding showed higher responsiveness scores

HCAHPS Responsiveness scores improved slightly from 2023

2024 fall occurrences in DSU through July were six

HCAHPS survey numbers remained low • Cipher rounds provide realtime feedback - higher survey numbers Accountability needed to adhere to standard work
