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

Providence Library Services has modernized the delivery of evidence-based electronic resources and professional library services across a complex health system environment. Using an innovative integrative organizational model, Providence Library Services leverages the skills of a small group of professional library staff who deliver significant value broadly across the organization. Touching nearly every job role, in every ministry, library staff have an impact on nearly all Providence health system operations.


PROVIDENCE LIBRARY'S LITERATURE SEARCH SERVICE: WHAT'S THE IMPACT?

Does our Literature Search
Service impact patient care and
save clinicians time? Providence
Library Services carried out an
IRB approved project to
systematically gather feedback
from our users. Throughout the
year every caregiver and
provider who requested a search
received a survey asking their
perceptions of quality and
impact of the search results.

With a 23% response rate, respondents came from across all Providence regions and job roles.

Results show, our searches add to caregivers' knowledge base, modify or confirm current clinical practice & policy, improve caregiver productivity, and impact advice given to patients. Caregivers perceived our literature search results as High Quality. Most respondents indicated that they saved 4 hours or more by using the literature search service. 


Time Saved by Using our Service






BY THE NUMBERS

2023 was busy year in the library!

- ▶ 191,000 visits to <u>providence.org/library</u> by over 50,000 unique visitors, showing a growth of more than 100% over 2022
- 692,104 articles downloaded from our collection, in support of clinical care, education & research
- ◆ 133,609 eBooks accessed, an increase of almost 30% over 2022. We provide many of the core reference textbooks to guide practice,
- ◆ 25,228 articles sent via email to caregivers across Providence from Library staff
- ◆ 1,335 hours of library instruction provided to caregivers across the enterprise
- 3,130 expert literature searches performed and reference questions answered.

SUPPORTING OUR NURSES

The Providence Library supports nurses by providing a wide range of evidence-based resources and services. We help nurses stay up to date with the latest advancements and evidence, enhancing the quality of their research and clinical decision-making.

The Library supports Pathways to Excellence and Magnet journeys through building and maintaining relevant library collections, providing educational support, collaborating on evidence-based practice and research projects, and disseminating the new knowledge created by our nurses.

Outreach to nursing specifically includes:

- ♦ Librarian representation on Nursing Research Committees across the enterprise
- ♦ Creation of a Nursing EBP and Research Pathway in Degreed
- Management of the Yammer Virtual Nursing Journal Club
- ♦ Updated <u>Nursing Research Resources Guide</u>
- Support of nursing scholarship through management of Nursing Conferences materials and a new Nursing Terminal Degree Collection in Digital Commons, highlighting publications by doctorally prepared Providence nurse authors


STRENGTHENING THE CORE: DEVELOPING OUR **CAREGIVERS**

Providence Library Services aims to support caregiver development in their current roles and beyond, building lifelong knowledge management and evidence-based practice skills. We deliver educational programming that teaches 21st century information literacy skills and have provided outreach and tailored support for educational programs such as Graduate Medical Education, interns and fellows, Clinical Academy, Nurse Residents, and students, including those at the University of Providence and the Covenant Schools of Nursing and Radiography.

Over 1,300 individuals received instruction from our Library Staff in 2023. Hundreds more accessed our online tutorials, links to free CME/CEU available through Library subscriptions, and how-to videos through our SharePoint Learning Portal.

New HealthStream Courses

Following the launch of Library 101 in 2022, 2023 saw the development and launch of 3 new courses. These classes were taught by a team of Librarians and offered 4x each throughout the year. Participants received 1.5 CEU hours for each. Comments and postclass likert evaluations were universally positive.



Video Library

Our staff created a library of short how-to videos accessed via our Learning Portal on SharePoint. This initiative created an opportunity for asynchronous learning, which is essential to many of our caregivers working outside of Library business hours.

To date we have 19 short videos, with dozens more in the works.

TRANSFORMING THE **FUTURE: SUPPORTING** RESEARCH AND **RESEARCHERS**

Providence Library Services supports clinical and bench research throughout every stage of the research cycle, from inquiry through knowledge dissemination. As a key resource on scholarly communication topics, we provide support around issues such as authors' rights, copyright, open access and predatory publishers. Caregivers can further develop their skills and knowledge through our

Publishing Resource Guide.

Librarians have collaborated with clinicians on research, participated in research training institutes, and earned IRB certification. We have conducted thousands of literature searches for busy caregivers and taught sessions on information appraisal and evidence-based practice.

While caregivers and researchers can always email us at librarian@providence.org for assistance, this year we added a new way for researchers to request library and publication support through the Health Research Accelerator's Research Pathfinder 2.0 app.


PROVIDENCE EXPERTS

In June 2023 we launched

Providence Experts research profile
platform. This portal creates complete,
accurate, up-to-date profiles for
Providence researchers and clinical experts, pulling data from PubMed, Scopus, ORCID, external funding databases,
and internal systems. Profiles aggregate
scholarly activity data in one publicfacing website. Together with
Providence's Digital Commons
institutional repository these two
systems provide a rich picture of the
Providence research ecosystem.

Benefits of Providence Experts include boosting institutional visibility, supporting collaboration and networking within Providence and externally as well as across disciplines. Providence Experts allows researchers and clinical experts to build an online presence and demonstrate research impact with quantitative and qualitative indicators, including hindex and other alt-metrics. Researchers, students, journalists and funding bodies can easily find publications and connect with experts.





REBRANDING AND GROWTH OF DIGITAL COMMONS






<u>Digital Commons</u> went through a rebrand and refresh to align with the look and feel of Providence Experts and Brand Strategy guidelines. We saw steady growth in collecting materials and building new collections. Notably, Digital Commons received increased global usage across 170 countries. Repository visits grew 9% from 2022-2023.
